As we continue in this challenging climate of the Covid19 pandemic, we would like to share with you some remote learning platforms we have put in place for your child. If your child has to self-isolate from school, or their bubble is sent home to isolate, they need to continue to learn. Therefore, we will be providing both work packs and online work. Staff will also keep in touch to check that the children are completing the work set and that they are managing to access the remote learning platforms.

Your child will bring home a remote learning workbook for them to complete school work in when it is required. The front cover of the book will have all the passwords in they need for the different platforms we are using.

Some information about each site we use is below.

See Saw

This can either be accessed on www.seesaw.me or by downloading the app onto an i-pad, tablet or mobile phone. This platform is how we can keep in touch with your child via messages, we can upload videos, power points and worksheets for them to access. You child can also upload work they have completed so the teacher can see how they are doing. Year 6 have been trialling this app for us and all really enjoy using it.

Times Table Rock Stars

www.ttrockstars.com We have been using this site for a year now. It is a fantastic, fun approach to learning times tables and we encourage the children to use it as much as possible.

Active Learn

www.activelearnprimary.co.uk This site is where your child can access Maths and English work that the teacher has set for them. The Maths page will show the children exactly what we will be covering in class that day too.

www.mymaths.co.uk A Maths platform that we will use for online homework and to set particular tasks for your child.

ePlatform

This is an app that you can download onto a tablet, i-pad or mobile phone. Once logged in, your child can access books from the library. They 'borrow' the e-book for 3 weeks. Some classes have started trialling this and are really enjoying reading the many books on offer.
