School PE and sport premium is a Government led initiative which provides funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport in Primary schools.

It is linked to 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

In the academic year 2022/23 Westvale will receive a total of £17,650 approx. We plan to use the funding to benefit our pupils as following:
