

Isabella really enjoyed "Orion & The Dark" so much that she persuaded Mr Richardson to start reading it!!






### Descriptive writing.

Steve came in this week to introduce himself and we discussed parking by the school. For the safety of the children please do not park or stop on double yellow lines or on the yellow zig zags.


## Letters from Zeus (Year 5)
