The first of our drop-in open evenings for Reception will be taking place on the 7th of November from 3:30-5:00pm.


If your child is in our Nursery class then feel free to come along.

Early Years Teaching staff. Refreshments will be provided whilst you explore our settings.


We will also be holding another drop-in open evening on Thursday 23rd November from 3:30-5:00pm.

## PSHE


Year 1 have been looking at things they are proud of in their PSHE lessons. They received proud tokens for staff telling them why we are all proud of them!


