

### English:

"Seal Surfer" by Michael Foreman tells the story of a boy who forms a special bond with a seal and learns to surf, despite his disability. Through his adventures, the book explores themes of nature, resilience, and family connections. empathy, overcoming challenges, and appreciating the natural world. Children will write a letter from the boy to his grandfather, describing the key events he has missed. This activity encourages descriptive writing and emotional expression

We will be exploring growing artists. Children will have an opportunity to develop their artistic skills in shading, botanical drawing and abstract fl



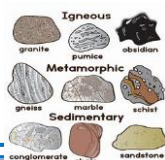
### History:



In history, children will explore how the daily lives of ancient Britons evolved from the Stone Age to Iron Age, comparing life 10,000 years ago to modern times, focusing on changes in lifestyle. Children will learn what people ate and what tools they used during the Stone Age.

### Science:

Complimenting our Stone Age focus, children will learn about three different types of rock (igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic) and begin to understand their properties. Children will learn how fossils are formed over time.



### Guided Reading:

We'll explore "The Sea Book" by Charlotte Winer. This is a non-fiction book that explores ocean life, marine ecosystems, and the importance of ocean conservation. Children can study it to learn about sea creatures, environmental issues like pollution, and how to protect our oceans, fostering awareness and responsibility for nature
