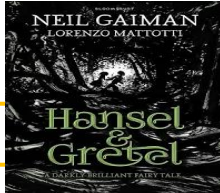


English:

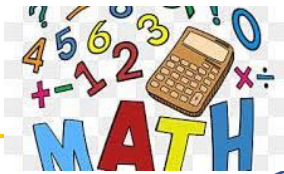
History:
