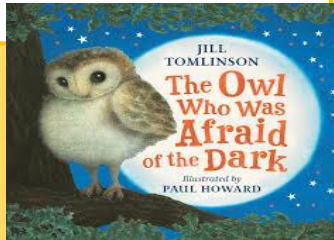


English:

Geography:
