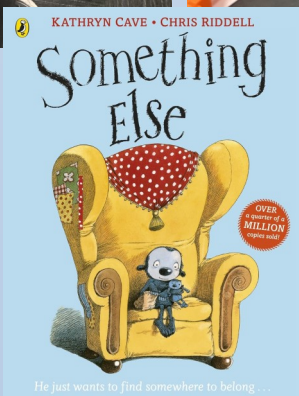
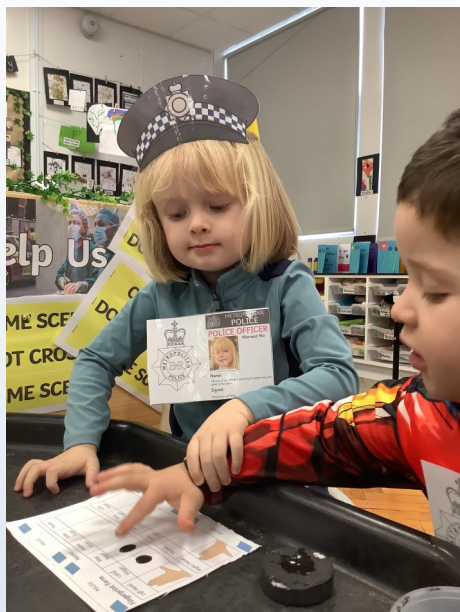
Greener Spaces
